Amber is a 35-year-old refugee from Pakistan. Indigo placed Amber in a community centre in Greece which serves 300 people, offering language classes, children's activities and health training.

Our partner Refugee4Refugees supports people on the move across Lesbos & Samos. Every day, their free shops provide aid items to 160 people, whilst volunteers provide classes to 120 students and run activities for over 130 children!* Since April we have sent them over 90 volunteers to help run their programmes. Indigo supports 82 more grassroots organisations like this. *Average per day

Simon Boyd - Medical Volunteer

Simon is a medical doctor from the UK. Indigo first placed him in Athens, and he eagerly returned to us for a second placement on Lesbos. On both occasions, Simon worked with refugees to provide acute emergency care on the streets, health advice in squats and full medical clinics for those living in the refugee camps.



This work has completely changed my life. I suddenly found a way to work and live that I had always been looking for. After my time volunteering in Greece, I have worked in Palestine, Sierra Leone and I currently live in Bangkok studying tropical diseases. I cannot stress how much those two volunteering trips changed the course of my life. I owe a lot to Indigo.

- 1. Inspiring friends and family to get involved
- 2. Returning to volunteer with the same project directly
- 3. Fundraising for the project they volunteered with
- 4. Spreading awareness for the cause
- 5. Working remotely for a projec
- 6. Joining other projects, or even starting their own
- 7. Pursuing a humanitarian caree
